There is much ministry to get on with now as we serve one another and seek to reach our town with the love of Christ, and so we won't want to just watch and wait until a new Team Rector & Vicar arrives.

As a staff team, we miss the leadership of Simon and we miss Sylvester's big smile, but though they leave big holes, we are in good heart, and continue to meet together to study God's Word on a Monday morning and encourage each other. I'm away for a few weeks convalescing, during which Josh Bailey will have pastoral responsibility, together with the vast wisdom and experience in the lay and ordained Parish staff team, and support from the deanery if needed. Christ Church and St Georges will be especially feeling the stretch of the vacancy now, and we appreciate their patience and grace in accepting changes to their service patterns, and are praying for the appointment of an interim minister.

The Team Rector appointment process continues, led by the Parish wardens. Last Monday evening, the PCC held a section 11 meeting at which the Parish profile and statement of needs were discussed, and some lay members of the selection panel approved. There will be a Section 12 meeting on December 2nd, at which the patron and bishop will be present. We hope to advertise on January 7th with interviews on March 4th. Christ Church

In August Sylvester left us, taking up a position in Sweden. Gratefully since then we've been well supported by the parish team. It's been wonderful enjoying such variety. We've even been found ministers to officiate at Christmas midnight and morning services. Numbers attending morning services have held up and grown at Church @ 5 under the care of Estelle, our LLM in training. In summer we enjoyed cream teas in church and a picnic at Bullscroft farm. We had a great feast at Harvest Festival "Big Breakfast". Numbers at Messy Church have been disappointing so we're trying a new format called "Play and Praise" though this too is struggling. Our occasional Friday "Praise and Worship" evenings have a faithful following and it's been good to see Sally and Hamad Bailey in the line-up. **Please Pray for**: the search for an interim team vicar; for church wardens Stephen and Chris, Estelle and others keeping the ball rolling; for our children's outreach that we might find the right vehicle; Christmas services including the Advent Service of Light, and carols with the Waterside Community Choir.

Emmanuel Church

Emmanuel brought their morning congregations back together in the Spring, which has been encouraging, but also fills the space on a Sunday morning and provides a challenge for future growth. Messy Church restarted on a monthly basis after Easter and has been attracting some local families. The vicar's bike accident at the beginning of the Summer has meant that Andrew and others have taken on extra responsibilities. We enjoyed hosting a joint men's breakfast with St Mary's, where Steve Gaukroger shared the gospel. Our home groups were reshuffled this Autumn, with new relationships being established, as we study the gospel of grace in Galatians. We enjoyed an excellent day away with Hope and Emmanuel Churches together in October, being wonderfully reminded that as Christians we are joined to Jesus. **Please Pray for:** John's recovery and energy for a stretched team; Bible teaching workshop open to all on Nov 23rd with Matt Searles; Christmas flyers going through all the doors in the district; our Christmas events and services through December.

Hope Church

Six months have passed since our official launch as Hope Church and there's so much to give thanks for. In God's goodness we now regularly have around 45-50 adults worshipping on a Sunday morning and between 15-20 children in our Sunday school, which presents a challenge in terms of needing additional leaders and helpers. We're building a good relationship with Ivingswood school and hope to be able to restart a Bible club there soon. We've started a monthly men's breakfast and a number of new home groups, including a daytime women's Bible study group and an evening discipleship group. New people join us regularly but we're currently thinking and praying about our vision and strategy to be more proactive in reaching out with the good news into Hivings and Pond Park. **Please pray for** Clarity of vision and wise use of limited resources; that we'll make the most of our first Christmas as we invite local people to our various services; the possibility of trialling 'Hope Café' next year.

St George's

We said our fond farewells to Sylvester and his family soon after our Fun Day in July. In the period since then we have continued our services, fellowship, learning and outreach activities as usual. We have retained, and probably strengthened our bonds with our sister Church in Waterside, Christ Church, and our near neighbours, Ley Hill Methodists.

The sun shone on our August annual coach trip, this year to Eastbourne, and our Harvest Festival service sent bumper quantities of supplies to the Marylebone Project, which we have supported for many years.

As we prepare for Advent, Carols at the pub (Hen & Chickens), school Carol services, Christmas services and next year, we look forward to welcoming a new Interim Vicar to support us through the next 18 months or so. **Please pray for St**. George's to continue to grow during this period of vacancy and beyond.

St John's Ashley Green

On Battle of Britain Sunday we held our annual service of Thanksgiving and Remembrance for the Battle of Britain, followed by a wreath laying ceremony at the memorial. This was well attended by the representatives from RAF Association, British Legion, Air Cadet's and the wider community.
